### **DOWNTOWN MASTER PLAN AND CITY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE:**

On Tuesday, January 18th, City Council met for their regular council meeting to consider the approval of a contract for professional services with DTJ Design for the Comprehensive Land Use Plan and the Downtown Master Plan. During this meeting, the City Council heard public comments and gave statements regarding their thoughts on the adoption of the contract with DTJ Design. Before the conclusion of the meeting the City Council voted 4 to 1 to approve the adoption of the contract with DTJ Design.

DTJ has prepared numerous Downtown Plans for communities similar to Nacogdoches and we have no doubt they will create a plan that supports the desires of our community. DTJ Design will be the prime consultant along with their team that includes experts in various fields necessary to write the plan:
